Latino Heritage Month (Sept 15 - Oct 15, 2022) celebrates U.S. Latinos, their culture, and their history of whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean, Central America, and South America. It originally started in 1968 by Congress as Hispanic Heritage Week and it was later expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to a month. September 15 was the start date as it's the anniversary of the independence of five Latin American countries (Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua).
